Alaska Railroad schedules open house in Fairbanks to discuss proposed capital project plans for 2009

Additional open house events in Anchorage and Wasilla

ANCHORAGE, Alaska – The Alaska Railroad (ARRC) invites the public to an open house on Tuesday, January 27, from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. at the Alaska Railroad Depot, 1745 Johansen Expressway, in Fairbanks. The venue provides an opportunity to review and comment on a proposed Program of Projects (POP) for 2009.

The open house will showcase continuing and proposed capital improvement projects that are in various stages – from conceptual planning to construction. Project managers will be on-hand to explain projects that are located all along the Railroad system from Seward to Fairbanks, with an emphasis on projects located in and around Fairbanks, Interior Alaska and system-wide, including:

- Northern Rail Extension (Eielson AFB to Delta Junction)
- Fairbanks Area Rail Line Relocation
- Fairbanks Freight Intermodal Improvements
- Nenana Rail Realignment
- Nenana Flood Damage Repair (FEMA)
- Healy Canyon Safety Improvements (including Moody Tunnel daylighting)
- Denali Park Passenger Train Turnaround Track
- Collision Avoidance System
- Replace Goldstream Creek Bridge and other bridge work
- Track Rehabilitation
- Siding Extensions at Cantwell and Saulich

The Fairbanks event is the last in a series of three POP Open House events. The other two open house events are scheduled as follows:

- **Anchorage** – 4:00-7:00 p.m. on Wednesday, January 21, at the Railroad's Historic Rail Depot (Ship Creek), 411 West First Avenue. Emphasis will be on projects located in Southcentral Alaska.
- **Wasilla** – 4:00-7:00 p.m., Thursday, January 22, at Evangelo's Restaurant, 2530 E. Parks Highway. Emphasis will also be on projects located in Southcentral Alaska.

Since 1996 through 2008, the Alaska Railroad will have received about \$795 million in federal grants that have been used to repair and improve an aging track infrastructure, to modernize signal and safety equipment, to build new facilities, and to offer valuable new services. About \$105 million in federally-funded grants is budgeted for 2009. Grants received from such agencies as the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) require a 9% to 25% funding match from ARRC. Since 1996, the Alaska Railroad has provided more than \$42 million to match grants, including \$4.6 million budgeted for 2009. In addition to matching funds, ARRC will have invested an additional \$215 million of internally-generated funds to support numerous non-federal capital improvement projects since 1996; this includes \$21.6 million for 2009.
